

Detective McCaffery authored a Search Warrant for Austin's residence seeking to recover evidence related to the sexual assault investigation. Items sought to be seized were identified, in part, as: bedding; trace evidence; buccal swabs from Austin; photographs of Austin; overall interior and exterior photographs of the residence, clothing; narcotics and narcotics paraphernalia; and home surveillance from the residence,							
Clark County Deputy District Attorney Ravi Bawa was notified and approved the probable cause provided by Detective McCaffery. Detectives McCaffery and Hendricks contacted Las Vegas Township Justice Court Judge Bita Yeager who authorized the Search Warrant for the residence at and for the person of Austin Russell.

Crime Scene Analyst (CSA) H. Ubbens, P# 14792, and Crime Scene Supervisor (CSS) S. Joseph, P# 8178, responded to assist detectives with documenting and recording evidence recovered during service of the Search Warrant.

During a preliminary search of the residence, detectives located a small floor safe in Austin's upstairs Master Bedroom and a large vault on the ground level. Both the safe and the vault were closed and locked. Sergeant Comiskey spoke with Austin regarding opening the floor safe and vault. Austin indicated he did not know the combination to the floor safe, but his assistant did. Austin verbally directed his assistant, Nick, to open the floor safe and Nick did so. Austin did not want police to enter the vault because he had "private things" in there. Sergeant Comiskey explained to Austin that having a Search Warrant for the residence authorized police to search inside the vault; Sergeant Comiskey further gave Austin the opportunity to open the vault or police would call a lock smith to gain entry. Austin was reluctant to cooperate, explaining he had marijuana and guns in the vault and he smoked "a lot of weed." Austin indicated, however, that he knew police were not at his residence out of concern for narcotics. Austin told Sergeant Comiskey that he preferred not to share the combination to the vault, but he eventually agreed to open it for detectives. As Sergeant Comiskey escorted Austin into the residence to open the vault, Austin indicated the marijuana in the vault was for his "personal use" and he again declared he smoked a lot of marijuana. Austin said there would be four ounces of marijuana in the vault and that he was not a drug dealer. Austin indicated he would typically buy large amounts of marijuana so he would not have to buy it frequently or one ounce at a time. Austin asked Sergeant Comiskey for leniency due to his cooperation. In the presence of Sergeant Comiskey, Austin pressed in the code to the vault door's locking mechanism and pulled down the handle. By this means, Austin opened the vault door. Austin was then escorted outside.

Given the information volunteered by Austin, it became apparent he was in violation of NRS 202.360, Ownership or Possession of Firearm by Certain Persons Prohibited, which states, in part, a person shall not own or have in his possession or under his custody or control, any firearm if the person is an unlawful user of, or addicted to, any controlled substance.

Detective McCaffery contacted District Attorney Bawa and reviewed the information provided by Austin. District Attorney Bawa approved the additional probable cause for guns to be sought and seized. Detective McCaffery contacted Judge Yeager who authorized the piggy-back Search Warrant.

Sergeant Comiskey along with Detectives Hendricks, Cody, and Tooley, conducted a search of Austin's residence. The search turned up the following items which were seized:

Detective Hendricks, Detective Fernandez, and Sergeant Comiskey conducted field narcotics tests (AKA – ODV Test) on narcotics located within Austin's residence. All of these tests returned positive results. Detective Hendricks was certified to perform said tests in November 2000, Detective Fernandez was certified to perform said tests in June 2007, and Sergeant Comiskey was certified to perform said tests in January 2000.

Detective Hendricks and CSA Ubbens impounded all of the above described seized items as evidence.

The 12 firearms seized from Austin's residence were run through records. Four of the firearms were registered to Austin:

- Sig Sauer P6 9mm handgun, SN M446139
- Kimber .45 caliber handgun, SN KR132954
- Walther P22 .22 caliber handgun, SN Z016592
- Ruger .357 revolver, SN 573-34341

Based on the above facts and circumstances, and statements made by Austin, including references to smoking "a lot of weed," a reasonable person would believe Austin unlawfully violated NRS 202.360, Ownership or Possession of Firearm by Certain Persons Prohibited, which states, in part, a person shall not own or have in his possession or under his custody or control, any firearm if the person is an unlawful user of, or addicted to, any controlled substance. Austin in fact owns several firearms and is an unlawful user of a controlled substance.

Austin did have methamphetamine and marijuana in his residence. These controlled substances were mostly contained within his bedroom, which is the Master Bedroom in his residence, and within his vault. Both the Master Bedroom and the vault contained items of personal property identifying Austin and showing his ownership and predominant interest in these areas of the residence which is shared by other residents and is frequented by many friends and aquaintances.

Austin was booked into the Clark County Detention Center and charged with Prohibited Person Possession of Firearm, Possession of Methamphetamine, Possession of Marijuana over 1 oz., and Possession of Schedule I - IV Controlled Substance (17 counts – one count for each Xanax bar).

It should also be noted that the amount of narcotics, narcotics paraphernalia, and narcotics related items found throughout the residence suggests Austin openly allows and participates in the unlawful use and possession of narcotics. Many of these items are commonly found with persons who package and sell controlled substances, i.e. plastic baggies and digital scales.

Detective McCaffery contacted District Attorney Bawa and explained the findings of the investigation and charges Austin was arrested for. District Attorney Bawa agreed probable cause existed to seek a search warrant to draw Austin's blood for the purpose of laboratory testing to establish if he was under the influence of

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a controlled substance at the time of his arrest. Detective Hendricks authored a Search Warrant. Detective Hendricks contacted Judge Yeager who authorized the Search Warrant.

Detective Hendricks, Detective McCaffery, and Sergeant Comiskey went to the Clark County Detention Center where Austin's blood was drawn pursuant to the Search Warrant to obtain a blood sample.
